The Challenge:

There are four sections to the 2021 challenge, covering the following Sustainable Development Goals:

Section 1: Clean Water and Sanitation - SDG 6

Requirements:

Complete **ONE** award and **ONE** requirement:

- 1. Earn the Public Health Award.
- 2. Earn the Project Award.
- 3. Assist in the implementation of a community service programme to promote Good Health and Living.
- 4. Visit your local sanitation centre to understand the challenges and needs of the community. Present your findings back to the Crew or another Scouting body.

Section 2: Affordable and Clean Energy - SDG 7

Requirements:

Complete **ONE** award and **ONE** requirement:

- 1. Earn the Civics Award.
- 2. Earn the Project Award.
- 3. Lead and manage an alternative energy project in your District, Region or community.
- 4. Run a clean energy event to educate and inform your local community/District.


Section 3: Decent Work & Economic Growth - SDG 8

Requirements:

Complete **ONE** award and **ONE** requirement:

- 1. Earn the Entrepreneurship Award.
- 2. Earn the Diversity Award.
- 3. Run an entrepreneurship day/fair for your local community to educate and inform those interested in entrepreneurship.
- 4. Visit your local business development centre (SEDA, Business Partners, Branson Centre, etc.) and find out the function the centre performs and what challenges the people in the community experience. Present your findings back to the Crew or another Scouting body.





Section 4: Sustainable Communities - SDG 11

Requirements:

Complete **ONE** award and **ONE** requirement:

- 1. Earn the Community Service Award.
- 2. Earn the Emergency Service Award.
- 3. Assist with a community service programme for 3 months or more that assists in providing resources to areas in need.
- 4. With your Crew, develop a short video/presentation of this goal and present it to a Scout Troop or another Scouting body.
- 5. Attend a public meeting or ward meeting where the municipal Integrated Development Plan (IDP) is discussed. Provide feedback on what your Crew believes to be the priority projects for your area.

ORProvide written comment on your municipal Integrated Development Plan (IDP) highlighting the needs of your community. (Refer to local government websites for further info).

NB: If an Award has been claimed previously, you cannot count it for another Sustainable Development Goal.

The SDG Champion badge for Rovers:

Scouts, Rovers and Adults who complete 8 individual SDG challenges over two or more years qualify for the SDG Champion badge. Any 4 badges you achieved as a Scout count when you are a Rover or Adult member, so you will be able to become an SDG Champion whenever you complete 8 individual challenges. Keep working to make positive changes in our world!
